

Uzbek President's Pakistan visit



PRESIDENT of Uzbekistan returned home Friday at the conclusion of his two-day state visit to Islamabad. The Uzbek president during his stay in the capital met President Dr Arif Alvi and Prime Minister Imran Khan.A number of agreements and Memoranda of Understanding were signed between the two countries during the visit of the Uzbek president. President Mirziyoyev marked the historic commemoration of the 30th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic relations between Pakistan and Uzbekistan. Pakistan and Uzbekistan are linked through a common faith, shared history and cultural affinities. The two countries have been closely collaborating at regional

and international fora, especially at the UN, OIC, ECO, and SCO. It was Uzbek president's first ever visit to Pakistan after becoming the President of Uzbekistan. He took over the charge of the Presidency after the demise of Islam Karimov who was the first President of Uzbekistan after the country got independence in 1992. Since then Uzbekistan has been on the move. The country, under the dynamic leadership of President Shavkat has made huge strides in all fields, especially in the field of trade and economy.

As regards the infrastructural development the country had done marvels. After having been to Uzbekistan on a couple of occasions, I can surely say Uzbekistan happens to be the apt example of modernity and religious tolerance. The country can rightly boost off its religious tourism potential and that is what the Uzbek president talked about during his joint press take-out with the Pakistani Prime Minister Imran Khan. He expressed hope to further deepen cooperation with Pakistan in the field of religious tourism. Both sides agreed for the early resumption of flights. Uzbek air used to operate from Lahore to Tashkent twice a week but it was discontinued due to Covid pandemic. Ostensibly, closure of the air link badly affected the tourism industry on both sides but it is good sign that leaderships of both countries, after realizing the difficulties of people, have now decided to reopen this route. The step is likely to further deepen people to people cooperation between the two countries. On Afghanistan both sides agreed to work together because peace in Afghanistan is directly linked to peace in Pakistan and Uzbekistan. In addition, all energy projects between the two countries can only be made operational when there will be complete peace there.

The hallmark of the visit perhaps was the signing of Preferential Trade Agreement (PTA) between the two countries. As per the PTA, a number of products will have duty free access to markets of both countries, which means consumers will get those products on cheaper rates. Besides, this arrangement is going to enhance trade and economic activity between Pakistan and Uzbekistan. Uzbekistan has signed the PTA with only a few countries and Pakistan happens to be one of them. Prime Minister Imran Khan announced to produce a joint movie on Babur in order to promote and strengthen cultural links between the two countries. Both Pakistan and Uzbekistan are gifted with rich cultural heritage. Cooperation in the field of culture would ostensibly provide both sides with an opportunity of benefiting from each other's cultural treasures.

In a nutshell, the visit can rightly be termed as a complete success. Pakistan, as per its Look Central Asia Policy, is already engaged with most of the Central Asian states. Establishment of direct air linkages would certainly do wonders in terms of enhanced trade and economic activity therefore all asides need to work zeal-ously to establish these linkages. The national flag carrier has to

take a lead in this regard. PIA has already hinted at opening new croutes in Central Asia. It is time now to act and act rather swiftly.

Pakistan, Uzbekistan friends for ever: PM Imran Khan

UZBEK PRESIDENT SHAVKAT MIRZIYOYEV SAYS BILATERAL COOPERATION WILL BE TAKEN TO NEW HORIZONS



ISLAMABAD: Pakistan and Uzbekistan have expressed commitment to revive the traditional cooperative partnership through improved connectivity. At a joint press stakeout with Uzbek President Shavkat Mirziyoyev in Islamabad on Thursday, Prime Minister Imran Khan said it is matter of satisfaction that trade between the two brotherly countries increased by 50 percent in last one year while joint ventures between the business communities of the two countries enhanced by 5 percent. The Prime Minister said we have decided to resume direct flights between the two countries that will not only improve connectivity but will help promote tourism and trade. He said train route with Uzbekistan will help boosting linkages with Central Asian States which will also benefit the war torn Afghanistan.

The Prime Minister said both countries will jointly produce a film on Mughal Emperor Zahir-ud-Din Muhammad Babur. He said he has shared his narrative on human rights violations in Indian Illegally Occupied Jammu and Kashmir to the Uzbek President. The Prime Minister said the United Na-



tions should fully implement the international law against human rights violations in the Indian illegally occupied Jammu and Kashmir. Over Afghanistan issue, the Prime Minister said we will be lobbying to unfreeze the assets of Afghanistan.He said campaign will be launched to devise ways and suggest measures for the recognition of Afghanistan. The Uzbek President in his remarks thanked PM Imran Khan for extending great hospitality. He said both Uzbekistan and Pakistan have many things in common adding especially the PTA signed between the two countries would usher in new era of progress between the two countries.

He said the railway line from Uzbekistan to Peshawar via Afghanistan will be yet another milestone between the two counties. He said Afghanistan needs humanitarian assistance at this critical juncture there the world community should come forward and help Afghans. Earlier, the two countries signed different Memorandum of Understandings including Strategic Partnership and Preferential Trade Agreement. Others agreements include cooperation in the field Television and Radio, Promotion of Pilgrimage Tourism, cooperation in the field of environment and climate change, Action Plan of practical measures in the field of security and cooperation in Railways. Prime Minister Imran Khan and Uzbek President Shavkat Mirziyoyev, who also signed the Pakistan-Uzbekistan Joint Declaration: "Next Step in the Strategic Partnership", witnessed the signing ceremony here at the PM House after the two leaders had a one-on-one meeting and wide-ranging delegation-level talks.

The agreement on cooperation in the field of Television and Radio Broadcasting between the National Television and Radio Company of Uzbekistan and the Pakistan Television Corporation was signed by Minister for Information Chaudhry Fawad Hussain and Uzbek Minister for Culture Ozodbek Nazabekov. The MoU between the Uzbek Ministry of Tourism and Sports and Pakistan's Ministry of Religious Affairs and Interfaith Harmony for the promotion of Pilgrimage Tourism was signed by Minister for Religious Affairs Noor ul Haq Qadri and Uzbek Minister for Foreign Affairs Abdulaziz Kamilov. The MoU between Uzbekistan and Pakistan on cooperation in the field of environment and climate change was signed by Special Assistant to the PM on Climate Change Malik Amin Aslam, and Uzbek Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Investment and Foreign Trade Sardar Umurzakov.

Advisor to the PM on Commerce Abdul Razak Dawood and Uzbek Minister for Investment and Foreign Trade signed the Pakistan-Uzbekistan Preferential Trade Agreement.The Action Plan of practical measures (roadmap) to further develop cooperation between Pakistan and Uzbekistan in the fields of security was signed by National Security Advisor Dr Moeed Yousaf and Secretary to the Uzbek Security Council Viktor Makhmudov.The MoU between Pakistan's Ministry of Railways and the Ministry of Transport of Uzbekistan was signed by Secretary / Chairman Pakistan Railways Habib ur Rehman Gilani and Uzbek Minister for Transport Ilkhom Makhkamov. The MoU on cooperation between Khokimiyat of Tashkent City of Uzbekistan and the Administration of Islamabad City of Pakistan was signed by MCI Administrator Hamza Shafqat and Uzbek Ambassador to Pakistan Oybek Usmanov.The MoU on cooperation between Surkhandarya Region of Uzbekistan and the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Province of Pakistan was signed by Secretary Industries Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Zulfiqar Ali Shah and Uzbek Ambassador Pakistan Oybek Usmanov.

JOINT DECLARATION

On Next Steps in the Strategic Partnership between the Republic of Uzbekistan and the Islamic Republic of Pakistan

1. At the invitation of the Prime Minister of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan His Excellency Mr. Imran Khan, the President of the Republic of Uzbekistan His Excellency Mr. Shavkat Mirziyoyev paid a state visit to the Islamic Republic of Pakistan on March 3-4, 2022.

2. The Leaders of the two countries held comprehensive consultations and considered all aspects of bilateral relations, paying special attention to the development of cooperation in the trade and economic sphere, science and technology, culture, education, security and defense and regional connectivity.

3. Emphasizing the centuries-old historical, religious, cultural and scientific ties between the two peoples and based on previously reached agreements, the parties agreed to further deepen and expand strategic partnership in all areas and in this context, decided to conclude a treaty on strategic partnership.

4. The Leaders also exchanged views on issues of global and regional importance, intensifying contacts in international forums, including within the framework of the United Nations, Organization of Islamic Cooperation, Shanghai Cooperation Organization and Economic Cooperation Organization.

5. The two Leaders reaffirmed their commitment to close interaction based on common positions and to continue the practice of mutual support at international and regional forums on all issues of mutual interest.

6. Prime Minister Imran Khan congratulated the President of Uzbekistan on the chairmanship of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) and the Economic Cooperation Organization (ECO) in 2022 and expressed Pakistan's full support for Uzbekistan's activities within the SCO and OIC, including the holding of the SCO Summit in the second half of 2022.

7. The President of the Republic of Uzbekistan Shavkat Mirziyoyev expressed the readiness to provide support to Pakistan's initiative to create a poverty alleviation mechanism during the period of Uzbekistan's chairmanship in the SCO.

8. Welcoming the 30thanniversary of the establishment of bilateral diplomatic relations, the two Leaders agreed to celebrate this milestone in a befitting manner by organizing joint activities.

9. President Shavkat Mirziyoyev shared his vision on the "New Uzbekistan" strategy and stated that the reform process is aimed at the socio-economic interests of the people of Uzbekistan and the region as a whole. The Strategy lays emphasis on strengthening economic diplomacy and sets tasks to bring existing relations with South Asia, in particular with Pakistan, to a new level of strategic partnership.

10. Highlighting the achievements in the socio-economic sphere, Prime Minister Imran Khan outlined his vision of the "Naya Pakistan" centered on social justice and economic security. He said that Pakistan's main emphasis has shifted from geo-politics to geo-economics. The Prime Minister shared details about the "Ehsaas" program aimed at reducing poverty and underscored that Pakistan's "Qaumi Sehat Card" (National Health Card) program is the first initiative in the field of medical micro-insurance for the citizens of Pakistan.

11. The two Leaders stressed the importance of developing institutionalized cooperation between the two countries within the five main pillars of Pakistan's "Vision Central Asia" political and diplomatic, trade and investment, energy and connectivity, security and defense and people-to-people relations.

12. Noting with satisfaction the intensification of the exchange of high-level visits between the two countries, the Leaders warmly recalled the positive agreements in the areas of trade and investment, customs, military education, culture and tourism, as well as visa facilitation for representatives of business community and tourist groups, reached within the framework of official visit of Prime Minister Imran Khan to the Republic of Uzbekistan on July 15-16, 2021.

13. The two Leaders agreed to expand cooperation between

the parliamentary bodies, exchange visits of the leaders of the Senate and the National Assembly of Pakistan and the Legislative Chamber and the Senate of the Oliy Majlis of the Republic of Uzbekistan and hold meetings between the established interparliamentary groups of friendship and cooperation.

14. The leaders noted with satisfaction that over the past five years, bilateral trade has increased fivefold, and despite the pandemic, it grew by another 50 percent last year.

15. The two Leaders welcomed the signing of Preferential Trade Agreement between Uzbekistan and Pakistan and the entry into force of the Transit Trade Agreement. These agreements are the sign of the beginning of a new era in bilateral trade relations and will serve to increase mutual trade by utilizing existing opportunities.

16. The Leaders welcomed the convening of 7th session of the Uzbek-Pakistan Intergovernmental Commission on Trade, Economic and Scientific and Technical Cooperation, 2nd round of Bilateral Political Consultations, the Joint Business Forum and the 4thmeeting of the Business Council, held on February 28 March 2, 2022.They welcomed the understandings reached as a result of these meetings in textiles, pharmaceuticals, building materials, banking and finance, the chemical industry and other areas.

17. The Leaders noted with satisfaction the interregional cooperation and linkages.

18. The Leaders recalled the outcomes of the International Conference "Central and South Asia: Regional connectivity. Challenges and Opportunities" held on July 15-16 2021 in Tashkent.

19. The two Leaders agreed on the need to fast track measures to further expand the connectivity agenda and economic integration. They acknowledged key role of agreed connectivity corridors which envisage expansion of trade links through offering investment opportunities in the transport network, power pipelines and Special Economic Zones in the interests of the two countries, region and beyond.

20. The Leaders reaffirmed the important role of the Termez-Mazar-e-Sharif-Kabul-Peshawar railway project for the future of the region. It was agreed to evolve a joint "Road Map", which includes measures to develop a feasibility study for the project and start construction work on both sides. They acknowledged that the Trans-Afghan Railway project is the most economical and shortest route connecting Central Asia with Pakistan's ports of Karachi, Gwadar and Qasim.

21. The two Leaders agreed to strengthen cooperation in the field of air, rail and road connectivity.





22. Recognizing with satisfaction the steady development of bilateral cooperation in security and defense, the two Leaders agreed to intensify dialogue and constructive cooperation between the armed forces of both countries, including through inter-staff talks and joint military exercises, training and exchange of professional experience. They welcomed the establishment of Uzbekistan-Pakistan Joint Commission on Security which held its first meeting in Islamabad on November 2, 2021.

23. Prime Minister Imran Khan and President Shavkat Mirziyoyev acknowledged the common cultural heritage and centuries-old fraternal ties and reaffirmed their commitment to further expanding cultural ties and relations between the two nations. In this regard, they welcomed the holding of the first Joint Seminar on the life of Zaheeruddin Muhammad Babur in Islamabad. The Leaders reviewed the progress of joint cultural and media projects, including the translation of Pakistani serials into Uzbek language and joint production on Babur.

24. The Leaders agreed to strengthen the cooperation between the leading education institutions of the two countries.

25. The Leaders praised the development of cooperation in the field of tourism and welcomed the signing of the Memorandum of Understanding on ziyarat tourism.

26. In order to facilitate tourism and business linkages between the two countries, the Leaders agreed to launch regular flights on the routes "Tashkent - Lahore" and "Islamabad - Tashkent".

27. The Leaders expressed deep concern on the continuing trend of Islamophobia. Supporting the efforts of the Organization of Islamic Cooperation to mark the International Day against Islamophobia on 15 March, the sides agreed to cooperate in the UN

General Assembly.

28. Uzbekistan expressed its full support for Pakistan's candidacy for non-permanent membership in the UN Security Council for 2025-2026.

29. The Leaders agreed to continue providing humanitarian assistance to Afghanistan and emphasized that peace and stability in Afghanistan is essential to advance connectivity agenda which will lead to regional prosperity.

30. The importance of economic assistance to Afghanistan and un-freezing of Afghan foreign bank reserves was also stressed.

31. Uzbekistan expressed its gratitude to Pakistan for hosting 17th extraordinary session of the Council of Foreign Ministers of the Organization of Islamic Cooperation on Afghanistan on December 19, 2021.

32. Prime Minister Imran Khan briefed the Uzbek side on the latest developments in Jammu & Kashmir, including concerns, position and pressing issues at the moment. The Leaders stressed the importance of cooperation and dialogue to resolve all outstanding regional disputes and achieve the goal of lasting peace, stability and prosperity in the region and beyond.

33. President Shavkat Mirziyoyev expressed his thanks to the Prime Minister of Imran Khan and the people of Pakistan for the warm welcome and hospitality accorded to him personally and the Uzbek delegation and expressed his best wishes for their continued progress and prosperity.

34. President Shavkat Mirziyoyev invited Prime Minister Imran Khan to pay an official visit to Uzbekistan at a convenient time.
35. The Declaration was signed in duplicate on March 3, 2022 in Islamabad in Uzbek and English.

Chairman Federal Flood Commission talks to Centreline

E NGINEER Ahmed Kamal, Chief Engineering Advisor and Chairman Federal Flood Commission said in an interview that the engineering body was established by the Government after creation of Pakistan as 'Central Engineering Authority' under the Chief Engineering Adviser. It was re-designated as Chief Engineering Advisor's Office after establishment of WAPDA in 1959. The then Office of Chief Engineering Adviser (O/o CEA) was mandated to mainly deal with the issues related to water, irrigation & power sector. Subsequently, two Wings i.e. Civil Engineering Wing and Power Engineering Wing were established in Office of Chief Engineering Adviser. In1977, Federal Flood Commission (FFC) was established for the purpose of Integrated Flood Management at National level and it was decided that Chief Engineering Advisor's Office will be the Secretariat of FFC. In 1987, Dam Safety Council was added to the office of CEA in 1981 to review plans for new dams & barrages and to carry out inspections of existing dams with DSO WAPDA. Administration and Accounts Wing of O/o CEA/CFFC provides logistic support to above stated four technical wings.

By means of being an ex-officio member of IRSA, and having pride to represent Pakistan in International Commission on Large Dams (ICOLD) and in International Commission on Irrigation & Drainage (ICID), the CEA & CFFC has a very strong coordinating role with Commissioner for Indus Water Treaty. Besides a study on Indus River Regime, O/o CEA & CFFC conducted three seminal studies on environmental flows and sea-water intrusion, known as 'Kotri Barrage Studies', which offered crucial input that went into drafting of IRSA Act and Water Apportionment Accord of 1992.

The office has the following core wings: (i) Civil Engineering Wing who is rendering its services since its creation in 1959.

(ii) Federal Flood Commission- added to the Office of CEA in 1977.

(iii) Power Wing – added to the office of CEA/ CFFC in fifties.(iv) Dam Safety Council – added to the office of CEA in 1981 (DSC-Wing)

(v) Admin & Finance Wing.

Pakistan is a country with diverse type of land and fluctuating pattern of climate. Climate is usually considered hot and dry in Pakistan but it has shown significant obvious variations in last few years. Many districts and urban centers located along the rivers banks are ever on a great risk to confront with various types of floods i.e. riverine flood, flash flood and urban floods particularly in Punjab & Sindh provinces. The floods cause damages to hundred thousand acres of fertile agricultural lands, standing crops and affect adjoining abadies with monetary loss in billions of rupees. Major direct flood damages are caused to agricultural lands, standing crops, urban and rural abadies, besides, other private & public property.

The riverine floods are generally caused due to heavy concentrated rainfall in the rivers catchments, during monsoon season, which is sometimes augmented by snow melt flows. Monsoon currents originating from Bay of Bengal and resultant depressions (weather system) often result in heavy downpour in the Himalayan foothills, which occasionally generate destructive floods in main rivers and their tributaries. Sometimes exceptionally high flood flows in major rivers are generated due to formation of temporary natural dams by landslide or glacier movement and their subsequent collapse.

Flooding of the Indus River and its tributaries represents the greatest hazard in Pakistan. Floods occur usually in summer season (July - October). Therefore, damages to agriculture sector are mainly to the standing Kharif crops. However, in some cases the inundated lands do not dry up in time and ultimately affecting sowing Rabi crops. The major rivers (Indus, Jhelum, Chenab, Ravi and Sutlej) and secondary rivers (Kabul, Swat etc.) cause flood losses by inundating low lying areas around the rivers bed by damaging irrigation and communication network, besides, land erosion along the rivers banks. In the upper part of the Indus Basin (Punjab & Khyber Pakhtunkhwa), floodwater spilling over the high banks of the rivers generally turns back to the main rivers channel.

He further said, in the lower parts of the country i.e. Lower Indus Basin (Sindh province); River Indus is flowing at ridge i.e. higher elevation than adjoining lands. That is why flood embankments have been provided along both sides of the river. The flood water, if breaches the embankments do not return to the main river channel. This largely extends the area and period of inundation resulting in more damages to abadies, standing crops and other private as well as public infrastructure. Sometimes breaches are occurred in the flood embankments, when the rivers attain the Exceptionally High Flood Level. At times, the flood embankments are breached at predetermined locations to save the main structures across main rivers. The remodelling/ rehabilitation works of Barrages, on the basis of 100 years





return period, were taken up by the Punjab & Sindh province. The construction of Khanki Barrage on River Chenab, rehabilitation of Jinnah Barrage & Taunsa Barrages on River Indus, Sulemanki Barrage on River Sutlej and Balloki Barrage over Ravi River have been completed. The remodeling work regarding Trimmu and Panjnad Barrages over Chenab River is underway. Remolding works on Guddu&Sukkur Barrages across River Indus is in progress. He told since its creation, Pakistan has faced various severe flood events i.e. 1950, 1955, 1956, 1957, 1959, 1973, 1975, 1976, 1977, 1978, 19981, 1983, 1984, 1988, 1992, 1994, 1995, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2019 & 2020, the 2010 floods were worst ever in the country. The floods of various magnitudes affected vast areas in the four provinces including Gilgit-Baltistan, Merged Area, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (Ex-FATA) & Azad Jammu & Kashmir.

Owing to adverse impacts of climate change, in the recent vears, vulnerabilities of communities to coastal & urban flooding have also increased. Flood damages are caused mainly due to riverine flooding in main rivers and flash floods in Secondary & Tertiary Rivers/Hill Torrents, Coastal flooding due to Cyclone & urban flooding due to torrential rains and inadequate storm drainage facilities, besides, GLOFs in northern parts of the country. According to World Urbanization Prospects (2014 revision), world is experiencing a historically unprecedented transition from predominantly rural to urban living. In 1950, one-third of the world's population lived in cities. Today the number has already reached more than 50% and by 2050, city dwellers are expected to account for more than two-thirds of the world's population. This rapid rise will mainly take place in developing countries. Africa and Asia are likely to be the fastest urbanizing regions with the urban population projected to reach 56% in Africa and 64% in Asia by 2050 (currently at 40% and 48%, respectively). He said that in last Flood damage can be greatly reduced. If people become aware that they should not build houses in river beds and take flood warning seriously. Do not delay in reaching safe places on flood warning.

ISLAMABAD: Satrang Gallery on Wednesday organised - a solo exhibition of Zulfikar Ali Bhutto at Islamabad Serena Hotel. Asma Rashid Khan Director Satrang Art Gallery briefed the audience about the salient features of the exhibition. Bera Paar is Zulfikar's very first exhibition in Islamabad and the series of multimedia works in the exhibition are a result of the artist's long term research project Bulhan Nameh. Zulfikar's focus is on a particular stretch of the River Indus, in Sukkur, a particularly mystical area with significant shrines and temples. This series of work brings

together the nuanced historical and cultural richness of Sindh. _"Bulhan Nameh is a long term research based project that looks at a selection of sites on the River Indus between Sukkur and Rohri in Sindh, Pakistan. Taking its name for the Sindhi word for the Indus River Dolphin, bulhan, this series intends to look at how in this 10 km long stretch of river punctuated at one end by the British era Sukkur Barrage and at the other by the island shrine of Khwaja Khizr, known locally to Hindus and Muslims as Zinda Pir. Here wildlife, history and spirituality collide with colonialism, capitalism, feudalism, as well as the ever more present modern state. Nameh, is a Farsi, Urdu and Sindhi word for diary-this particular diary is written through printmaking and textile. Cyanotypes, analog photographs and archive are paired with traditional Sindhi embroidery as a way to root this project within its current cultural landscape, as well as with memory, nostalgia and a sense of loss. Sukkur is the last place where the river is still full much like She was before the dams and barrages, it is the last refuge of the Indus River Dolphin and a site that evidences syncretic religious practices that still carry on in modern Sindh. The Indus is per-

sonified as Sindhu Mata, a river that not only gave Sindh its name but also India, Hinduism and all derivatives of these words. In my research I do not intend to expose all elements of the river at this location but instead I hope to re-mystify the Indus and in so doing allow us to re-imagine Her as a living and ever changing entity rather than just an exploitable resource."

Zulfikar Ali Bhutto

Zulfikar Ali Bhutto (b. Damascus, 1990) is an artist and curator whose work resurrects complex histories in the South Asian, South West Asian and North African region. In the process he unpacks the intersections of religion, storytelling, futurity and environmental degradation through a multi-media practice rooted in printmaking, textile and performance. Bhutto has shown work and curated exhibitions globally, as well as spoken extensively on the intersections of faith, radical thought and futurity at Columbia University, UC Berkeley, NYU, Stanford and the Indus Valley School of Art and Architecture. Bhutto is currently based in Karachi, Pakistan and received an MAH in History of Art from the University of Edinburgh in 2014 and an MFA from the San Francisco Art Institute in 2016.

Western Disinformation Campaign: Bye Bye to Journalism



HREE days after Kyiv had asked Ankara to close the Bosporus and Dardanelles straits to Russian ships. Mevlut Cavusoglu; Turkey's foreign minister, said on 1stMarch that Turkey will activate the Montreux Convention and ban Russian war vessels from entering the Black Sea through the Bosporus and Dardanelles straits.Although Turkey has yet to spell out its officialstatement butFrance24 reporting confidently saying thatTurkish government has invoked the clause of the Montreux Convention, regarding the movement of naval vessels through the straits of Bosporus and Dardanelles.Let's first understand what this convention is and what the implications of invoking it in the current situation are. This convention was signed on 20thJuly 1936 at the Montreux Palace in Switzerland and went into effect on November 09. 1936. This convention regulates the traffic in and out of the Black Sea. It provides for completely free access for civilian vessels and gives Turkey the right to restrict the navies of countries not belonging to the Black Sea. You can get further details about this Convention online from open sources. The questions that arise are: 1) Why has Turkey decided to invoke this convention? 2) How will it affect Russia or Ukraine? 3) Does this invocation show Turkish partiality? These are the questions which come to mind right away. The first 2 questions can be best answered by the relevant countries and their representatives. But the third question is open to interpretation. And ves it is "interpretation" that is the base of Western reporting these days. The Western journalists have stopped seeking facts. They utter all the interpretations or narratives that they are provided by their respective handlers. Now the Western Media i.e. France24, is portraying this news as a victory for Ukraine, Turkish partiality in Ukraine's favor, and Turkish declara-

ever, a very quick fact check can tell vou that such a decision by Turkey has nothing to do with its "Anti-Russia" stance, and the Russian Navy will not be affected by such controls. The Russian Navy belongs to a Black Sea state so its movement will not be and cannot be hindered. Secondly Ukraine is without a navy right now, so in fact Turkey is effectively blocking any Western nations from embarking on a naval endeavor. So dear France24. it is a blockade against Western warmongers.Turkish decisionis indeed a decision made by a sovereign state, according to the current situation in the region, and we hope they must have weighed all outcomes and consequences. But why are the Western media outlets spreading such unfounded information, and spinning it? There could be multiple purposes, for instance convincing other Muslim countries, like Pakistan, to rethink their position. The imperialist Western minds understand that Turkev is among the leading Muslim countries. so an anti-Russia partisan decision by Turkey might fool others into rethinking their positions.

Another example is BBC showing a report, where allegedly Russians are making a mass exodus towards Finland. There are some fundamental flaws in this report. These are the restrictions imposed during the COVID19 pandemic.

The fact of the matter is that many Russian citizens, who had arrived in the EU during the days preceding this conflict and air traffic ban imposed by the EU, have no way of returning, so most of them have crossed through Finland to return to Russia. Although there are other border crossings as well, but Estonia has closed its border, so people return through Finland. Unfortunately BBC decided to flip the video and show it as if people were running away from Russia, but how and why is BBC doing so? Is BBC not afraid of being sued for false reporting? Or is BBC not afraid of losing credibility?

First of all BBC is not a monolithic organization. The part of BBC which is spreading false information, or which is lying, is BBC International or BBC World Service. This organization is not regulated by the Office of Communications(Ofcom), which is the main media regulatory authority in UK. This davcare center caters for children of Russian parents, who work in Helsinki. But, unfortunately BBC is tasked by its masters to do everything to cover-up all Nazism, fascism, xenophobia, Russo-phobia, and all other growingly negative trends in Europe and the UK. You cannot hide the ugliness of Nazism, by pulling masks of deceit on vour Western faces.

Khojaly genocide is a dark chapter in human history, say Speakers

The conflict between Azerbaijan and Armenia over Nagorno-Karabakh is one of the most contentious issues of the twentieth century

ISLAMABAD: Muslim Institute and the Azerbaijani Embassy in Islamabad jointly organized a seminar on "Genocide and Ethnic Cleansing: A Crime against Humanity, the 30th Anniversary of the Khojaly genocide". Among the speakers were Federal Minister for Food Security and Research, Syed Fakhar Imam, Federal Minister for Economic Affairs Omar Ayub Khan, Dewan of Junagadh and Chairman MUSLIM Institute Sahibzada Sultan Ahmed Ali, Ambassador of Turkey Ihsan Mustafa Yurdakul, Ambassador of Azerbaijan Khazar Farhadov and Vice Chancellor, Quaid-e-Azam University Prof. Dr. Muhammad Ali Shah.

The conflict between Azerbaijan and Armenia over Nagorno-Karabakh is one of the most contentious issues of the twentieth century. Armenian nationalists have been following a policy of ethnic cleansing of the Azerbaijani people for the last 200 years. From 1948-to 1953, around 150,000 Azerbaijanis were deported from Armenia. Similarly, in 1988, 250,000 Azerbaijanis were forced out from their historical territories thereby leaving Armenia a mono-ethnic state.

In February 1992, Armenian forces seized the Azeri-populated town of Khojaly. Armenian militants started the massacre of civilians in Nagorno-Karabakh. Despite the Armenian occupation and genocide, the people of Azerbaijan remained steadfast, and as a result of the 2020 Armenian aggression, war broke out again and Armenia had to concede defeat after 44 days of conflict.

The speakers said that Pakistan and Azerbaijan were two brotherly Islamic countries which were closely related to each other in the spirit of Islam. Pakistan has always supported the principle stance of Azerbaijan on Nagorno-Karabakh, that's why Pakistan has not recognized the Armenia till date. This position of Pakistan is in fact in line with the ideas of Quaid-e-Azam Muhammad Ali Jinnah, the founder of Pakistan. Speakers further stressed that Pakistan and Azerbaijan have to further strengthen the bilateral relations by cooperating with each other at the regional and international levels and promoting bilateral cooperation in other fields including military, education, trade and other fields while keeping in view the ground realities.



Accelerate Sustainable Actions to Combat Impact Of Covid-19 on Global Psychological Health

HE new Covid SARS-CoV-2 (COVID-19) pandemic has been recorded as extraordinary in late history, leaving a worldwide impact including high paces of mortality and severe psychological deterioration, economic recession, and supported social confinement for billions of individuals. The impact this emergency has had on populace psychological well-being, both in the short-and long term is obscure. There is negligible amount of proof with regards to the intense stage emotional wellness effects of huge scope pandemics across networks. Assembling early proof of the effects of COVID-19 is crucial for illuminating psychological well-being administration conveyance as the pandemic and its lengthy impacts proceed.

The long hauling novel corona virus disease emerged as the deadliest and the most unprecedented pandemics in the annals of global crisis, causing worldwide unrest, fear, and expiration of countless human lives. As per the present reports according to WHO, corona virus is affecting more than 219 countries, with a total of 415.5 million confirmed cases, including 5.8million reported deaths across the globe, these may not include unreported cases due to mild symptomatology and 71,640,365 new cases. The US, India and Brazil have seen the highest number of confirmed cases, followed by the UK, Russia and Turkey. Very few places have been left untouched.

The widespread morbidity and fatalities associated with the recurrent waves have led to a mass economic recession, exhaustion of medical equipment and resources, occupational pressure alongside educational distress, and a myriad of psychological implications due to unmet needs and agonizing National and International measures that infringe on personal freedoms to combat the disease are among the key stressors that undeniably augment the widespread emotional distress and run the risk of psychological illnesses associated with Covid-19.

Thereof, the deadly virus marks an unmanageable public health crisis and declared as a Public Health Emergency of International Concern, unfamiliar in the last century, the corona virus pandemic has reported to impact the psychological resilience of an overwhelming majority of individuals across the globe besides being catastrophic for physical health.

The 2019 pandemic has toppled the natural course of existence for practically all the nations in the world. The resultant strategic instructions of social isolation, nationwide lockdowns and stay-in place (mass home confinement) directives have instigated significant effects in terms of mental health including loneliness, stress, anxiety, depression, frustration and uncertainty. The current statistics of COVID-19 show that the psychological effects of contagion and quarantine is not restricted merely to the fear of contracting the virus. Factors such as separation from loved ones, loss of opportunity, vulnerability with regards to the progression of the disease, and pervasive feelings of helplessness have surfaced to cause collective hysteria, panic, and elevated anxiety amongst the populations ranging from mild to severe mental health problems.

Public health emergencies impinge on the health, safety, and welfare of both individuals (causing insecurity, confusion, emotional turmoil, and stigma) and communities (owing to monetary losses, work and school closures, shortage of resources for testing and treatment, and lacking conveyance of necessities). These impacts decipher into a scope of emotional retorts, unhealthy behaviors (such as excessive substance use), and resistance to public health mandates (such as home confinement and vaccination) in individuals who acquire the illness and in the overall population. Broad research in disaster mental health has established that emotional turmoil is omnipresent in affected populations - an inference certain to be reverberating in populations affected by the Covid-19 pandemic.

Certain groups have been reported to be more vulnerable than others to the psychosocial effects of the pandemic. Particularly, individuals who contract the disease, those are more prone to it (including the elderly, people who are immuno-compromised, and those living or receiving care in foster homes), and individuals with prior history of medical, or psychiatric complications are at heightened risk for unpleasant mental health consequences.

Children and young adults are especially at risk of psychological sequel as that of difficulty concentrating, boredom, irritability, insomnia, restlessness, nervousness, sense of loneliness, uneasiness, and worries. Health care providers, who are in close contact with COVID-19 positive patients are also predominantly vulnerable to emotional distress in the current pandemic, given their heightened risk of exposure to the virus, constant fear of infecting their loved ones, shortage of personal protective equipment (PPE), extended workload, unbearable stress, helplessness and grief seeing infected patients die alone.

Henceforth, emphasis on psychological resilience is imperative during the COVID-19 pandemic. Mutual support from family, friends, and a special caring loved one encourage wellness and enhance coping mechanisms in the midst of dire circumstances. During such a time of globally imposed time & again lockdowns and stay-in orders, it is vital to nurture these relationships and to find ways to stay connected with those we care about.

Day-to-day activities are also crucial. Exposure to the sunlight and outdoors for a few minutes each day and a tad bit of exercise can help improve focus and general feelings of well-being. Taking out a few minutes to reflect what we are grateful for also improves the attitude to cope with stress. Individuals who foster a sense of gratitude have better mental strength and physical well-being. Moreover, one should let alone thoughts of "what if and what not?" as they are fuel to the fire of stress and worry. It will only take us to a place we do not want or need to go.

Another coping mechanism entail discontinuing negative self-talk. The more we ruminate on negative thoughts, the more they have power over us. Most of our negative thoughts are just thoughts, not facts, that are our own skewed perceptions. Recognizing and labeling thoughts as thoughts helps evade the cycle of negativity and turning towards a positive mindset.
